Looking back on 2022, there were significant events for CCSC, both planned and unplanned. 2022 was the year that we expected to offer a full schedule of competitions, coming off two years of cancellations caused by the Covid pandemic. The first unplanned event was the collapse of a drain pipe underneath the Nora Starks Memorial Horse Arena in April. The result was that the arena was unusable for the rest of 2022. As a result, CCSC revised its competition schedule to sponsor some of the larger events at the Union County Saddle Club in Blairsville, GA. We did sponsor an educational clinic using the warm up arena next to the competition arena, and our trail riders explored both local and regional trail complexes. We presented our vision of future development of the facilities that we have been using to the Cherokee County Commissioners. We believe that our proposal to develop a covered arena at the site would benefit both our group and the wider Cherokee County community as well. As we begin 2023, we continue to plan for the future and offer programs that our members want. We invite you, our members, to express your opinions and describe what you would like to see in CCSC's future.

COMPETITION HIGHLIGHTS

CCSC and the Union County Saddle Club jointly sponsored eight Battle Lines Series barrel races. Each club contributed equally to fund year end awards for this series. The four races that CCSC operated were held at the Union County Saddle Club due to the drain pipe collapse at our local arena. These races combined resulted in a total of 407 timed runs. We paid back 75% of entry fees in prize money, and we also added an extra \$750 to the prize money pot for each race. The result was that we gave out a total of \$12,995 in prize money in 2022.

We also revived the Trail Challenge competition that began in 2020. Participants signed up and used an app to track their miles and other data while on the trail.

The 2022 Battle Lines and Trail Challenge winners were recognized at an Awards Banquet, where they received belt buckles, breast collars, and saddles, among other items. We thank all our competitors who came out and supported these programs.




COMMUNICATIONS



VISION FOR THE FUTURE

In March 2022, CCSC presented a proposal to the Cherokee County commissioners to further develop the Cherokee County Fairgrounds site where we have held events. We advocated for a clear span covered arena and stabling for horses. The economic analysis that we provided described the benefits of this development to Cherokee County businesses and organizations. We concluded that the number of event days per year at the site would increase to 40 to 50, and sales tax collections in the county would increase by \$100,000 per year. The county administration is currently looking at possible funding sources for this development.
